



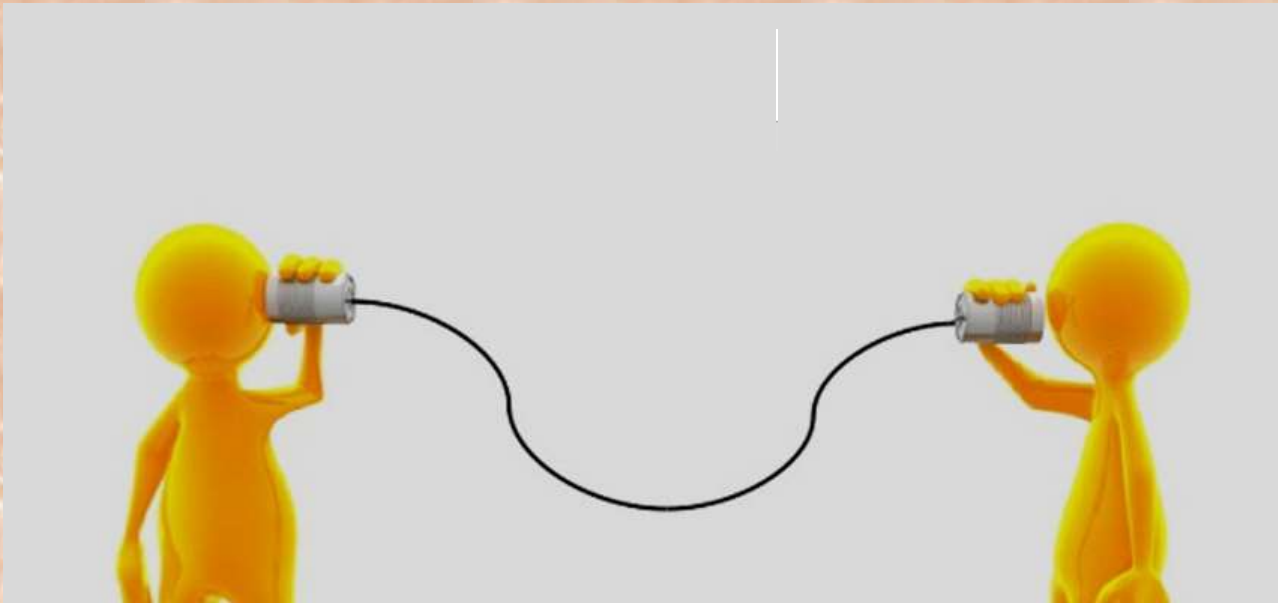
Pastoral Prayer
