Leviticus 19 (portions) (NRSV)

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying:

²Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them: You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy.

³You shall each revere your mother and father

⁹When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. ¹⁰You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen

grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien

¹¹You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another.

¹³You shall not defraud your neighbor; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a laborer until morning.
¹⁴You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind;

¹⁵You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbor.

¹⁶You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people,
¹⁸You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself:

²⁹Do not profane your daughter by making her a prostitute,
 ³¹Do not turn to mediums or wizards

³²You shall rise before the aged, and defer to the old
 ³³When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien.

³⁴The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt:

³⁵You shall not cheat in measuring length, weight, or quantity.
 ³⁶You shall have honest balances, honest weights, and measures.

Matthew 22:35-40

One of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."
